Instructions:

You will see 10 Bible verses with blanks to fill in. In the first blank, write the helping verb - has or have. Decide which one you need, depending on the subject.

In the second blank, write the past participle of the verb in parentheses. Most of the past participles are regular, except for two that were highlighted in the lesson. If there is another irregular present perfect verb in the sentence, it is highlighted in orange for you.
