

# Worksheet for Future Simple

## Instructions:

These sentences from stories in Luke 18 in the CEV are in the present simple tense.

First, change them to the future simple tense. First, change the verb to its base form if necessary. Then, add the helping verb "will."

Then, make your future simple sentences into questions by putting the subject between the helping verb "will" and the main verb.

Finally, make your future simple sentences negative by adding "not" after the helping verb "will." You may make a contraction (won't) if you like.

## Example:

	The children come to Jesus. (v. 15)
(future simple)	The children will come to Jesus.
(future simple question)	Will the children come to Jesus?
(negative future simple)	The children will not come to Jesus. (The children won't come to Jesus.)

## Now you try! Change these sentences into future simple, future simple questions, and negative future simple.

1. The man respects his father and mother. (v. 20)
2. The disciples leave for Jerusalem. (v. 31)
3. The disciples understand. (v. 34)
4. The blind man begs beside the road. (v. 35)
5. The blind man answers Jesus. (v. 41)

## Answers

1. The man respects his father and mother.  
The man will respect his father and mother.  
Will the man respect his father and mother?  
The man will not respect his father and mother.
2. The disciples leave for Jerusalem.  
The disciples will leave for Jerusalem.  
Will the disciples leave for Jerusalem?  
The disciples will not leave for Jerusalem.
3. The disciples understand.  
The disciples will understand.  
Will the disciples understand?  
The disciples will not understand.
4. The blind man begs beside the road.  
The blind man will beg beside the road.  
Will the blind man beg beside the road?  
The blind man will not beg beside the road.
5. The blind man answers Jesus.  
The blind man will answer Jesus.  
Will the blind man answer Jesus?  
The blind man will not answer Jesus.
