# There Is or There Are?

**There is** means that something exists, or is in a place. We use **there is** when something is singular, and **there are** when something is plural. Here is an example:

There is milk in the glass. (milk is a singular noun, so we use there is)
There are cookies on the plate. (cookies is a plural noun, so we use there are)
